ORDER NO: 2018-039 **SUBJECT:** Missing Persons

DISTRIBUTION: All Department Personnel

PURPOSE: To establish uniform departmental guidelines for the handling of

missing persons reports.

I. DEFINITIONS: New York State executive Law (837-E) defines a missing child as any person under the age of 18 missing from his/her normal and ordinary place of residence and whose whereabouts cannot be determined by a person responsible for the child's care and any child known to have been taken, enticed or concealed from the custody of his/her lawful guardian by a person who has no legal right to do so.

II. PROCEDURE:

- A. Upon being dispatched to a missing person report, the officer will respond in person to complete a report. The officer will adhere to the following procedures:
 - 1. An incident report will be completed by the reporting officer. The report should contain the following:
 - a. Circumstances surrounding the disappearance.
 - b. Description of the missing subject.
 - c. Date, time, and location last seen.
 - d. Possible places the missing visits.
 - e. People the missing associates with.
 - f. Any other pertinent information that can assist.
 - 2. A recent photo of the missing should be collected.
 - 3. All relevant information shall be sent to Orleans County Dispatch for a county wide broadcast on the radio.
 - 4. The missing person **will** be entered into the portal as soon as practical and a copy of that message will be attached to the incident report.

- 5. In cases where a missing person has disappeared under the elements of foul play, against their will, or the result of a child abduction the Lieutenant and Chief of Police will be notified as soon as practical.
- B. Upon the reported return of a missing person, the officer will respond in person and will amend the incident report.
 - 1. Officers will notify Orleans County Dispatch of the returned missing for a county wide broadcast.
 - 2. The missing **will** be removed from the portal as soon as practical and a copy of the cancellation **will** be attached to the incident report.
- C. If a missing person is located by patrol the following procedures should be followed.
 - 1. The legal guardian or person in care of said missing person will be notified that the person has been located as soon a practical.
 - 2. The primary means of returning a missing person should be the legal guardian coming to the location of where the missing was located, however with certain circumstances patrol can transport missing persons back to their residences.

**** Note: If circumstances surrounding the missing person are the result of abuse by the legal guardian, CPS should be notified as soon as possible. Returning the missing person should be based upon a totality of circumstances; how quick CPS gets back to the notification, officer's observation of any visible signs of physical abuse, and validity of the missing person's statement/position. Although, rarely encountered with missing persons, officers should consider the above before returning the missing to his or her legal guardian.***
